



War Department General Orders No. 89, dated May 13, 1910, established a badge for the officers and enlisted men of the Coast Artillery Reserves. These reserves were the various state National Guard coastal defense units. Men were to wear the badge on the left side of the campaign hat. If the hat was not worn the badge was to be worn on the left coat breast, "above the line prescribed for other badges and medals."

The badge lasted until February 1917. It was rescinded in both the Uniform Regulations by Changes 19 and in Uniform Specifications by Changes 10.
