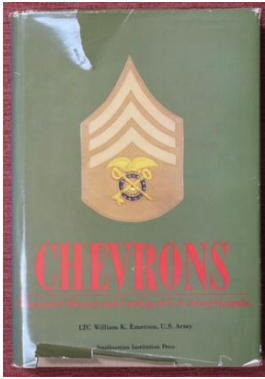

Clean copy of *Chevrons*, published by the Smithsonian Institution in 1983. Includes photos and tables showing all U.S. Army chevrons authorized until the book was published. Inscribed by the author in the front but otherwise in good condition, save for a few tears on the top and bottom of the dust jacket. \$100, including postage within the U.S.

Jewish chaplain's stole. Still has the DSA tag showing the stock number and nomenclature "Scarf, Chaplain Jewish Faith." Two sections near the edge have marks showing rust where it was next to metal. The most noticeable is shown to the left of

the national eagle and the second is not as large in another location. \$75 including postage with U.S. I also have two Christian stoles, one from the 1960s with cross and eagle and another from the late 1970s with just an outline cross. Each is \$50.



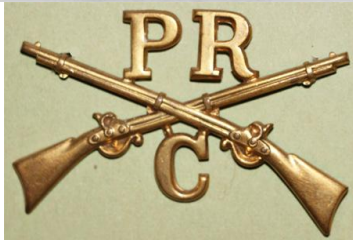
1903 collar insignia for Philippine Scouts, 4th Company I have had this since the late 1960s. Original scarce enlisted pin-back collar insignia. \$250 including postage in the U.S. A rare insignia seldom found on the market. RVN made 11th Air Assault Division badge for wear by those 1st Cavalry Division members who had earned the badge while in the U.S. Obtained in An Khe in early 1967 with the 1st Cavalry Div. \$80 including postage in the U.S.

1903 collar insignia for Puerto Rico Regt, Company C I have had this since the late 1960s. Original scarce enlisted pin-back collar insignia. \$250 including postage in the U.S. A rare insignia seldom found on the market. This is shown elsewhere on this website.



Cap insignia, Battery N, 2d Artillery, 1899-1901. N and O batteries existed only between 1899 and 1901, as discussed on this website under Artillery Insignia from 100+ years ago. A rare insignia. \$225 including postage in the U.S.

Two different made in Korea **Combat Artillery badges** worn by forward observer worn during the Korean War. Both have the entire design struck from a single piece of metal and the red rectangle painted.



One is approximately 1/4 inch longer than a standard CIB. The easiest way to tell the difference is by examining the lower center of the wreath. \$60 each including postage in the U.S.

World War I **ordnance lieutenant's cap**. Made in France with gold embossed marking on the sweat band showing it was made by Pomel, at 3 Rue Noailles, Marseille. Also inside on the crown the yellow lining is a similar marking in black. Cap shows moderate wear and the leather sweat band shows a little discoloration. \$125 including postage in the U.S.



World War I **infantry machine gun lieutenant's cap**. Blue and red cords, one above the other trim the curtain. Has a bullion lieutenant's bar. No maker's mark. Lining of this scarce cap is olive drab cotton. \$150 including postage in the U.S. I have other WW I caps. Email if interested.



Left: Pair of 1880s-1902 knots for commissary captain of the 12th Infantry Regiment, New York National Guard. Excellent condition with New York buttons. \$175 including postage in the U.S.

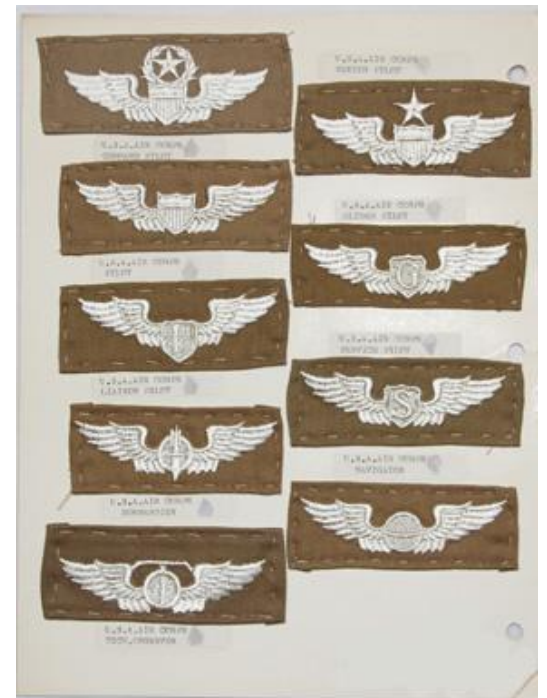

Complete set of domed disks plus DI for 26th Infantry, made in Germany by Lauer in Nuremberg. Companies A thru M (less J that did not exist), plus HQ, SV for Service Company, and HVM for Heavy Mortar. From the 1950s. See the one example for HVM Company. \$240 for the set, which is \$15 for each. Only sold as a set. Extra postage for mailing outside the U.S.



Howitzer Co. flat screwback disk for 369th Infantry, c. 1940. \$27 including postage in the U.S.



Made in Germany airmobile badge from about 1980. Hallmarked by Stephen Krammer. \$27 including postage in the U.S.

Made in Germany the early 1950s, for 370th Infantry Bn, a slight dome disk for one of the last segregated units. Headquarters & Service Co. \$30 including postage in the U.S.



US Military Academy Band collar insignia for dress uniform, from 1966. Clutch back version. \$30 including postage in the U.S. Also have screw-back version from same period as well as similar for US Army Band with "US" on lyre. Obtained these in 1965 and have one each of clutch back and screw back style as same price.

At right, silver dome military intelligence disk. \$30 including postage in the U.S.
