7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry dome disk for HQ, 3d Battalion, late 1950s, made in Korea.

Separable disk with 7 above sabers and small HQ3RD below all struck as one piece. Part of the 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division. \$40



Dome shaped cavalry disk for Service Troop (SV below sabers). In very good condition, domes crossed sabers with SV below. Circa 1946-1950. Separable clutch back. \$25. I have other interesting cavalry collar disks.



Dome shaped cavalry disk 5 above and I below. 5<sup>th</sup> Cavalry, Troop I silver colored dome shape disk. In excellent condition. Separable clutch back. \$25. I have other interesting cavalry collar disks.



Set of 6 dome shaped cavalry disks, HQ and A, B, C, E, and F Troops. Silver colored, clutch back, excellent condition. \$80 for the six.



Screw-back disk for 1st Armored Car Squadron, Troop A. Old original separable disk with slight dome, 1 above, A below, with A and C in horizontal angles. Has screw-back nut. \$200.



Unusual unassigned dome disk with small eagle in a ring that uses the WWII officers' unassigned collar insignia. Clutch back with a design that unscrews. \$25.



Silver dome unassigned Christian chaplain's assistant collar disk. Clutch back with a design that unscrews. \$25.



WW II screwback 174<sup>th</sup> Infantry with number below & Company L above. Crossed rifles placed higher on the disk that usual. This allows the regimental number 174 to fit well below, and with Company L letter above. \$25



Unusual, scarce infantry disk with unit struck as part of background, rifles removable. For Headquarters 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 29th Infantry, that was stationed at Fort Benning in the 1930s. Screw back with rifles removable. The designations are made as part of the background: 1 above, 29 below, BN and HQ in side angles. \$35.

Unusual, scarce infantry disk for cannon company with unit struck as part of background. For Cannon Company, 29th Infantry, that was stationed at Fort Benning in the 1930s. Screw back with rifles removable. The designations are made as part of the background: CN above, 29 below. \$40.



1<sup>st</sup> Infantry screw-back disk, 1936-39, for Combat Trains. Above is 1 and below CT. Has button type fasten as usually found on officer insignia of the 1930s, and has one short post on back of one of the rifles that fits through a small hole on the disk, to keep design from rotating. \$30.

Screw-back disk for 54th Infantry, Headquarters Company. \$20.

WW II screw-back coast artillery for search light company. Flat separable background. Block SL for searchlight company below. \$25.



WW II screw-back coast artillery disk with slight dome shape for search light company. Rounded "S" for \$25 **including shipping** in the U.S.



Coast artillery dome disk in excellent for 501<sup>st</sup> Battalion, with number below. The unit received campaign credit for the South West Pacific in WW II. \$25

1945-46 Made in Germany dome disk for Company C, 552d AAA Battalion. Unit was in 5 Europe campaigns during WW II. Screw-post back with finely threaded post & nut, typically German made. \$25.



Coast Artillery screw-back two-piece disk for Combat Trains. Flat disk with CT below for 1940 Combat Trains of an AA battalion. \$25.

Silver dome disk for 80<sup>th</sup> AAA Bn, a part of the 82d Airborne Division. Insignia used before 1951. \$25.



1902-1905 Engineer, Company A, large dress uniform, pin-back gilt collar insignia. Large size was replaced in 1905 by smaller castles. \$45.

Rare 1902-1905 Philippine Scouts Company 24 pin-back bronze collar insignia. Large size was replaced in 1905 by smaller rifles. \$175.



Two 1902-1905 pin-back bronze infantry collar insignia. One for 28<sup>th</sup> Infantry, Company G, the other 6<sup>th</sup> Infantry, Company B. Large size was replaced in 1905 by smaller crossed rifles. \$50 for the two.



Two 1902-1905 pin-back bronze engineer collar insignia. One for Company D (in 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion), the other Company M (in 3d Battalion). Large size was replaced in 1905 by smaller version. \$60 for the two.

Scarce bronze pin-back collar insignia for electrician sergeant, 1902-1905. \$50.



Scarce silver color, screw-post cap insignia for Hospital Steward, 1896-1900. \$100.

Group of three screw-back 1896-1905 cap insignia for company/troop/battery trumpeters. Only two men from each company sized unit were authorized. For 11<sup>th</sup> coast

arty company or 11<sup>th</sup> field arty battery, for 74<sup>th</sup> coast artillery company, and for Company C, 29<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. \$35 each.

Troop I, 13<sup>th</sup> Cavalry, screw-back cap insignia, 1901-1905. Smaller size came into use in 1905. The right sword handle has verdigris on it. \$25.



Rare 1899-1905 dress cap insignia for electrician sergeant. Screw-post back that was replaced in 1905 by a smaller design. \$150.

Group of 16 domed field artillery disks. In the group, L to R, starting on top row: Slight dome with unusual cannons which are at a steeper angle. Dome has embossed ring around the lower edge. Mint condition disk. The red enameled edge is made as part of the silver dome. Row 2: Airborne wings below. Silver with 25 above. Silver with 98 above. Brass with 199 above. Row 3: 360 below. 675 below. Silver with 502 above and HQ below. 162 in small numbers above and marked N S Meyer. Last row: German made, A above and 85 below. German made, SV above and 44n below. Made in Germany slight dome with 517 above that is struck as a single unit. A above and 700 below. \$250 for the group, which averages \$15.60 each.



Rare Army Transport Service enlisted cap ribbons (tallies) used 1904-1920s. One for U.S.A.T. EGBERT and the other for U.S.A.T. HANCOCK, where U.S.A.T. stands for U.S. Army Transport. \$500 for the two rarely seen insignia.

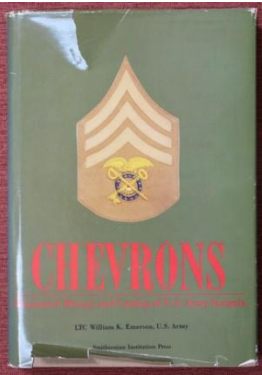
Rare dress cap insignia for Corps of Engineers field musician (company trumpeter). Screw-back insignia used from 1896 to 1905. Replace by straight trumpet in 1905. \$200.



Jewish chaplain's stole. Still has the DSA tag showing the stock number and nomenclature "Scarf, Chaplain Jewish Faith." Two sections near the edge have marks showing rust where it was next to metal. The most noticeable is shown to the left of the national eagle and the second is not as large in another location. \$75.

Two different made in Korea Combat Artillery badges worn by forward observer worn during the Korean War. Both have the entire design struck from a single piece of metal and the red rectangle painted. One is approximately 1/4 inch longer than a standard CIB. The easiest way to tell the difference is by examining the lower center of the wreath. \$65 each or \$120 for the two.



Clean copy of *Chevrons*, published by the Smithsonian Institution in 1983. Includes photos and tables showing all U.S. Army chevrons authorized until the book was published. Inscribed by the author in the front but otherwise in good condition, save for a few tears on the top and bottom of the dust jacket. \$100.

WW II warrant officer insignia marked on the lower back as shown in enlarged detail: K. C. LUKE and MELB for Melbourne, Australia. Clutch back. \$50.



1951-1955 officer armor insignia with 66 above. The number and the rest of the insignia made as one piece (see enlarged detail). Made when the 2d Armored Division came to West Germany early in the Cold War. \$40.

Dress cap insignia for QM NCO, 1905-1916. In excellent condition and hard to find. \$80.
