



Army Instructor Identification Badges

The army began to award the Army Instructor Identification Badges in July 2014. NCOs who work as TRADOC instructors may earn these badges, which are in three levels: basic, senior, and master. Requirements are listed in AR 614-200 and TRADOC Regulation 600-21, plus for the basic badge soldiers must complete 80 hours of instruction as a primary instructor, and meet evaluation requirements after two separate evaluations 30 days apart. Award of the senior badge also requires graduate from the small group instructor training course/intermediate facilitation skills course and the systems approach to training basic course/foundation training developer course, plus also completion of 400 hours as a primary instructor.

Master Instructors must earn both the basic and senior badge, graduate from the advanced facilitator skills course or the faculty development program-1 and the evaluating instructor's workshop, then also meet evaluation requirements and master instructor board requirements outlined in TRADOC Regulation 600-21.

These badges were first listed in US Army Pamphlet 670-1 (Uniforms and Insignia Guide), May 25, 2017. Subdued metal or cloth badges may be worn on the Army Combat Uniform and the full-color versions on army service uniforms.
