

National Guard Recruiter Badges, 2008 Designs



The previous set of National Guard Recruiting and Retention Badges were replaced by larger and more garish versions in 2008 after the Director of the Army National Guard requested a badge that more accurately reflected the Recruiting and Retention mission. As before, these are awarded in three degrees (basic, senior, and master).

The basic badge is silver colored. The senior badge changes the central Minute Man design to gold color, then adds a gold colored outer edge that includes a green laurel wreath and at the badge top, a hexagon. The master badge adds the words "Peritus" in a gold arch above the hexagon. The senior and master badges were designed to be modified to show awards such as "Master 7" and "Director's 54" by adding "7" or "54" on the hexagon.
