


B1, \$1,600. Pair of very scarce silver embroidered wings for infantry. Typical of 1800-1830 militia, in good condition. No buttons.



B2, \$500. Pair of epaulettes for infantry privates, Mexican War.in excellent condition. Made by Horst mann & Company. Rarely seen. B3, \$1,000. Silver metal cap plate for the Savannah Republican Blues, circa 1836. Shown and discussed in *Smithsonian Institution Bulletin* 235, by Duncan Campbell and Edgar Howell, 1963, page 78. Made over 20 years before Civil War. **BELOW: WW I Overseas caps**







B10, \$40. !939 coat for officer Assigned to 9th Inf Regiment at Fort Sam Houston. Has a few moth nips. Name of original owner given to purchaser.



B11, \$20. 1945 jacket with cloth rank. Worn by QMC officer who commanded a Black unit during WWII. Name of original owner provided to purchaser.



B12, \$20 1945 coat with bullion rank and overseas bars. Worn by same QMC officer as discussed at the left. Name of original owner provided to purchaser.





B13, \$100. 1930s German cigarette card album. Made to hold 160 cards showing dress uniform from WW I and before, 27 cards are missing.





O42, \$80. Very unusual sealed sample from May 26, 1903. Sealed samples of branch cord trim for dress blue uniforms prescribed in December 1902. All branches are sealed on this one sample. Close up of tag at the right. The wax seal with QMG seal is on the other side.



B14, \$250. WWI AEF armband made in France to distinguish the Army Chief Engineer and his staff. Below trench clip which was to be used when visiting forward areas. The blue and white trench clip was for Corps Chief Engineer and staff and by the Corps Chief Signal Officer.




B17, \$20. Made by Rock Island arsenal, 1909. To protect coat when polishing coat buttons.

B18, \$10 privately made coat protector used when shining buttons. B19, \$75. Official army sealed sample of Air Medal, dated 20 July 1945. Seal is on other side of tag.



B20, \$30. 40+ pages with unit history & rosters by company plus foldout map where unit served during the war. Printed in Toul, France.



B21, \$10. Menu and roster, Company K, 20th Infantry, Camp Travis, TX, 1922 Christmas.



B22, \$15. Menu and roster Ambulance Company 135, 109th Sanitary Train, 34th Div Camp Cody, NM, 1917, Thanksgiving.



B78, \$800. Set of US Army surgeon's epaulets in original tin carrying case. Case marked, "RIDABOCK & CO FORMERLY BAKER & MCKENNEY 141 GRAND ST. NEW YORK." In the case is a lock of hair, presumably the doctor's or his wife's.







B 85 USAF cord for aide, \$20.

Equipment tags used in 1920s & 1930s. The unit and soldier's number were embossed on the central bar. Each tag has three metal triangles which were inserted through the equipment such as canteen cover, then bent over. \$20 each.



Made in Italy in 1945, vase with 34th Division and Fifth Army patch designs, plus symbol of Florence, Italy, \$80 (includes postage).



B81, \$750. 1872 pattern dress chapeau for staff officers and Medical Department officers. General were authorized these chapeaus for full dress into WWI. Chapeau is in excellent condition. Box lid has some of the edges missing, as shown.



B92, \$40. Cap used by Spanish-American War veterans, Massachusetts Post 52 with gold embroidered eagle and post number. Slight mothing on top as shown at right, otherwise good.
